Hineuru Leaders Programme

Taiohi Ora aligns with the Hineuru strategy and overall vision of growing Hineuru. To grow our people, we need grow and inspire leadership amongst our younger generations. The basis of the Taiohi Ora programme is built upon the foundation for Hineuru's vision: 'Ka Tipu', 'Ka Ora' and 'Ka Rea'.

Ka tipu: We grow

Hineuru are in a development phase where we are looking to grow leadership. We want to provide a platform to encourage rangatahi between 14 and 18 to develop networks, support each other and build leadership potential. The Taiohi Ora leadership programme will encourage young people to develop their own leadership attributes and skills. Some of the skills to include in the training are:

- What it takes to lead a team
- Thought innovation
- Communication
- Skills in planning and managing projects
- Hineuru design challenge

We want rangatahi to feel empowered to choose their own pathways. Those selected for the programme will be expected support each other in being and learning about Hineurutanga.

Ka ora: We thrive

Taiohi Ora will look to those alumni of the programme to provide mentoring and support to the next set of Hineuru leaders who have been identified. This will in turn create a community of Hineuru leaders and a network of relationships so that the Hineuru iwi brand and image is shared positively with external agencies. These relationships will be critical in ensuring Hineuru continues to succeed.

Ka rea: We prosper

As part of the leadership programme, each participant will be asked to identify an issue with respect to the iwi and develop strategies and designs for improving the issue or issues faced by Hineuru.



Programme

A week-long leadership programme available for up to 15 Hineuru beneficiaries between 14 and 18 years old from Monday 14 January to Thursday 17 January 2019.

- Venue:** All participants will be based at Te Hāroto Marae, State Highway 5, Napier-Taupō Road, Te Hāroto. Some activities will take place around the Hineuru rohe, including farming activities on Hineuru Station (Waitara Road), rafting along the Mōhaka River and other activities.
- Accommodation:** Te Hāroto Marae
- Transport:** Parents to drop participants off on Monday 14 Jan, 12.30pm for pōwhiri. Parents welcome to attend hākari in evening of Thursday 17 Jan at Te Hāroto Marae and will take children home afterwards.
- Transport to all activities during the Leadership Summit will be provided.
- Food:** Food will be provided.
- Activities:** Water rafting, learning about tikanga and kawa of Hineuru, farm visit, swimming, physical exercise, preparing a hangi, harakeke/working with flax, tuna/eel catching, writing, listening and innovation challenges.
